

Title V Senior Employment Program



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MISSION

At EdAdvance's Title V senior community employment program, we provide work-based training for individuals, 55 and older, who have limited financial resources and are looking to join the workforce. In turn, Title V also pairs employers with trained, motivated workers who can fulfill important roles in their organizational team.



Through the Title V program, older workers have access to Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP) services as well as other employment assistance available through the One-Stop Career Centers of the Workforce Investment Act.

Whether they be learning new skills, such as working with computers, transitioning back into the workforce, or collaborating with a trainer in finding a new occupation, our professional staff is specially trained to help job-seeking seniors connect with gainful employment opportunities.

SERVICES

Title V trainees receive personalized help in identifying and achieving their employment goals. After receiving orientation, Title V enrollees are placed in a part-time job training position with a local non-profit agency such as a library, community center, or social service organization.

Enrollees' salaries are paid by the Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP). This arrangement allows participating employers to connect with dedicated workers and supports participant employees as they gain contemporary work experience and an opportunity to re-enter the workforce.



After several months to a year, participating Title V enrollees may be hired by their non-profit employer. Ultimately, our goal is to connect Title V enrollees with a good job within the public or private sector.
