BIRTH TO THREE STAFF

EdAdvance Birth to Three Program

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BIRTH TO THREE

Birth to Three delivers early intervention services and full developmental evaluations to infants and toddlers (0 to 3 years old) with developmental delays. The program's goal is to support parents as their children grow and develop. Birth to Three works closely with families and school districts to ensure a smooth transition to pre-kindergarten services at age 3. Birth to Three is based on an integrated developmental model which places children in the context of their families and surrounding environment.



EdAdvance Autism Program (EdAAP)

EdAAP is an autism-specific birth-to-three program that provides full developmental evaluations and early intervention services to children who are diagnosed with autism and provides support to parents as their children grow and develop.

The full autism assessment may consist of a variety of tools. Some of these may include:

- The ADOS (Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule)
- The Behavior Assessment System for Children, Second Edition (BASC-2)
- The Sensory Profile
- The Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales, Second Edition



SEED (Services for Early Education and Development)

Services for Early Education and Development (SEED) is a Birth to Three program which provides full developmental evaluations and early intervention services to children who experience significant developmental delays and provides support to their parents as their children grow and develop.

Individualized services are directed at sharing strategies with families, which enhance their child's development, and are incorporated into their child's natural daily routines and activities. Intervention services are provided in the child's most natural environment.
